Common questions about supplies for Band:

- Should I rent or purchase an instrument? Renting an instrument will give your child the opportunity to begin in band with only a small initial investment. Should you need repairs these are often covered by the rental agreement. Typically, the instrument can be returned to the company at any time without further obligation. Usually, all rent applies towards purchase.
- When should we order a rental instrument for our child? The sooner the better. Some stores will
 deliver the instrument to the school at the beginning of the year and you won't have to worry about it
 over the summer. Most stores start to run low on stock towards the beginning of school and your child
 may not receive their instrument in a timely manner.
- When does our child need to start bringing their instrument to school? We start as soon as possible. Students are typically asked to bring their instruments and books on the 2nd day of school.
- Aunt Sally played the clarinet in high school, can Junior use it for band class? Possibly. It will most likely need to be inspected and repaired. I can check the instrument for you or you can take it directly to a local music store for repair.

^{**} It is advisable to avoid purchasing instruments at department stores, eBay or from pawn shops due to the poor quality of instruments typically found there.

 - Valve Oil [one bottle should last a year]
