



SKJAJA Fund granted over \$5,000 to local children during the 2009–10 school year.


The SKJAJA Fund provides underprivileged school-age children in Chapel Hill and Carrboro the opportunity to participate in social and educational enrichment activities such as: team sports or camps, art or dance classes, educational camps; school band/orchestra, etc.

Since the SKJAJA Fund was inspired by a "pay it forward" project the children are required to "repay" their gift by doing a good deed for someone or their community – and expect nothing in return. And, in "pay it forward" fashion they can request their recipient do the same.

Students and parents (or guardians) are required to apply for funds. Students must be referred by the school's Family Specialist. The application is then voted on by the board and the money is paid directly to the program.
